FALLEN WILLOW

The large willow that fell this winter has damaged the pond lining, pump and wiring. The pond was drained in February while exploratory investigations are carried out to see the extent of the damage.

Once all work has been done, the pond will be refilled. This is done at a high tide and water from the Thames.

The wildlife saved from the pond (mostly goldfish) will be reintroduced and hopefully will flourish.



Fulham Football Club is hoping to commence work on their stadium this year. To this end part of the Fielders Meadow will be sectioned off for storage of materials, site office and ingress of large machinery.

The club is going to be making best use of its riverside situation and aims to remove most debris and bring materials to site via the river.
